

WSAPC students may be using devices offered to them by the Department for Education, devices on loan from WSAPC, or their own personal devices. All of these devices will not be protected whilst they're online at home by the same internet filtering system used on WSAPC premises. As a result, you may wish to implement parental controls offered by your home internet provider.
